*Entries are \$12.00 per class (excludes 5.5% nominate processing fee). Entries can only be made at www.nominate.com.au

*No phone, fax or email entries are accepted.

*Beginner classes for financial members only- (Beginners pony does not need to be a palomino)

*Dorothy Fitzgerald Fashions in the Field- free to enter on day.

*The NSW Palomino Society Inc. reserves the right to change these judges without notice.

*All HORSES must be owned by a financial member and all Palominos, Cremellos and Perlinos must be registered with the NSW Palomino Society for entries to be accepted. Applications for registration can be made via email at registrar@nswpalominosociety.asn.au

*All strappers, spectators and support crews must be either a member of the New South Wales Palomino society Inc or New South Wales Arabian horse Association Inc or Arabian horse Society of Australia , or any other affiliate of the AHSA, EA or SHC for insurance purposes, or be willing to sign a waiver on the day, and must produce a wristband when requested. Wristbands can be picked up from the show office, once a waiver has been signed. NSW Palomino Society Inc members can pick up their insurance wristbands with their exhibit numbers.

* Horses entered in Double registered classes need to email a copy of their other registration papers and proof of current financial membership of that group/society/association etc to secretary@nswpalominosociety.asn.au

* Horses can compete in both hack, bridle path hack and show hunter classes

* BROODMARE Class: Open to mares of ANY AGE.

* Eligible entries must meet the following minimum requirements and the onus is on the exhibitor to prove eligibility if required:

* a) Mare must have carried, delivered, nursed & weaned at least two (2) foals (embryo transfer foals will not count toward the total number of foals carried).

* b) If a Mare is nursing a foal the foal must be led and must accompany the mare at all times. The foal shall not be less than 4 weeks (28 days) of age and handled by a handler 18yrs and over.

* c) Any mare shown must not be more than nine months (275 days) in foal at the date of the show.

* d) If a mare more than 150 days in foal is to be shown, a Service Certificate or Pregnancy Certificate from a licensed veterinarian or reproductive technician must be available for inspection at the show by the Show Committee.

* e) Any eligible mare may show in the Broodmare class. A mare may compete in a brood mare or open mare class but not in both at the same show. – NO CROSS ENTRIES are permitted between the Broodmare class and the respective age divisions

*Newcomer: a horse which has not competed under saddle (except for racing) at any show prior to 1 January 2019. Must be ridden in a snaffle bit.

*Novice: a horse or rider who has not won a 1st place in a similar event in the Open Ring of a Hack, Breed or Agricultural Show. Novice horses must be exhibited in a snaffle bit.

*Intermediate: a horse or rider who has not won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in a similar event at any Royal Show.

*** THIS IS A MEMBERS ONLY SHOW**

*All handlers/riders who are not members of the NSW Palomino Society Inc. or the AHSA or an AHSA affiliate or Equestrian Australia or Show horse Council will need to pay a \$10.00 day insurance fee. Please contact info@nswpalominosociety.asn.au to organize day insurance prior to the close of entries. It is the responsibility of the NSW Society member/owner to ensure that their handlers/riders are insured and that the handlers/riders name(s) are listed on the online entry form. Failure to comply may result in entries not being accepted.

***ALL PROFESSIONAL HANDLER/RIDERS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE NSW PALOMINO SOCIETY OR AHSA OR AN AFFILIATE OF THE AHSA, EQUESTRIAN AUSTRALIA OR SHC NEED TO SUPPLY A CERTIFICATE OF CURRENCY OR PAY \$30.00 REGISTERED PARTICIPANT.** Proof of currency or fees are payable prior to close of entries. Failure to comply may result in entries not being accepted.

*Special classes judged by all 3 judges in Ring 2 are:

1. Best Presented of Show
2. Best Mane and Tail of Show
3. Best Coat Colour of Show

4. Grand Champion of Show

(Winner of Supreme in each ring that is Supreme Stallion, Supreme Mare & Supreme Gelding)

5. Best Ridden Novice of Show

6. Best Ridden Newcomer of Show

7. Supreme Ridden of Show

These special classes will be judged as they occur in the program.

*Whilst on the showground no horse is to be ridden without approved safety helmet at any time.

*No plaiting of manes or tails will be accepted in either halter or ridden classes.

*No false tails or mane pieces will be permitted in either halter or ridden classes.

*The judge's decision is final and no protests will be entered into.

*All handlers/riders of stallions/colts must be 18 yrs and over.

*Any person acting in a rude, unsafe or socially unacceptable manner will be asked to leave the showground and no refund given.

*Any horse which in the opinion of the judge or ringmaster is dangerous will be asked to leave the ring.

*No colour enhancers or glitters are to be used in either halter or ridden classes.

*Cremello/perlino classes are open to horses registered with the NSW Palomino Society Inc.

Entries should be completed on the entry form and sent prior to the closing date.

*Competitors must supply own breast plate holder for numbers. Breast plate numbers must be displayed on each horse in every event.

*Riding classes, are only open to NSW Palomino Society Inc. members.

*Horses in classes 101-103 & 201-203 may be of any colour

*Horses in classes 301-303 may be palomino, perlino or cremello.

*Youth classes open to Youth Members' of the NSW Palomino Society. Horse may be Perlino, Cremello or Palomino. Competitors in Youth classes may not compete in Beginner Classes in this Ring.

*Beginner classes are open to Beginners who are members of the NSW Palomino Society. Horse or Pony may be of any colour. These classes are not point scored. Beginners may not compete in Youth classes in this Ring.

*Veteran classes are open to horses 12 years and over.

*A brood mare can only compete in a brood mare class in the led mare section. Brood mare class is open to mares either in foal with vet's certificate, with a foal at foot or had a foal recorded with NSW Palomino Society Inc in the past 2 years. Winner eligible for Champion Mare.

*Horses who are eligible Newcomer and Novice may be shown in both.

*Junior horses are defined as horses who are 3 years and under.

*Senior horses are defined as 4 years and over.

*Bridle Path hack classes-open to palominos, perlinos and cremellos.

The outline of the horse in a Bridle Path Hack class is not as collected as that of the Show Hack.

Paces should be balanced with cadence and the horse should move forward with ease and smoothness, displaying impulsion. The horse should be obedient, have bright expression and respond willingly to light contact. Transitions to be smooth and forward. The head position should be slightly in front of, or on, the vertical.

Guidelines for Judging:

Horses to be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. The Judge may ask exhibitors to lengthen the strides at any gait

a. The Judge must require the horses to back.

b. Riders shall not be required to dismount.

c. Horses should be asked to reverse at a walk and trot. The turn is to be made towards the centre.

d. Lengthening of the trot or canter should always be performed on a straight line with no increase of speed.

e. Competitors taking excessive time to pick up gaits will be heavily penalised.

f. No individual workouts / place getters are selected from the circle.

g. After working on the circle, horses will be asked to line up; the Judge will move down the line to request a rein back from each horse. In the rein back, riders are not required to look over their shoulder. Horses should be inspected for condition and conformation.

To be Judged: 80% Performance and Manners 20% on Condition and Conformation.

Personal Appointments - Bridle Path Hack:

English riding coat

Breeches, or Jodhpurs, short or long riding boots

Shirt with tie or stock “ratcatcher” collars permitted for ladies.

Gloves are optional but preferred.

All colours shall be acceptable, but preference is for traditional conservative colours.

(Optional)

English type spurs, rowelled or dummy. Stock pins or tie pins. Hacking canes with or without flapper. Riding Crops. (Prohibited) Dressage whips. Brooches or western jewellery

Tack Appointments

Bridles: Regulation snaffle bridles with Dropped/Hanoverian or cavesson nose-bands. Rugby Pelhams and Spanish Snaffles with cavesson nose-bands. Pelham and full Weymouth bridles (bit and bradoon) with cavesson nose-bands and curb chains. Curb chain covers and lip straps are optional. Excessive tightness of nosebands to be penalised at Judge’s discretion.

Saddle: Straight or forward cut show, dressage or general purpose saddles.

(Optional)

Quarter markings.

(Prohibited)

Martingales of any type. Draw Reins. Tie-downs. Boots or Bandages

*Show Hunter classes-open to palominos, cremellos and perlinos.

Guidelines for Judging:

Horses competing in the Show Hunter classes are not required to jump.

Judging is primarily done on the animal’s suitability, conformation and straightness and freedom of movement. The Show Hunter should be forward going and should exhibit a certain amount of presence, animation, and impulsion at all paces.

Judges should be looking for suitability as a Show Hunter and the priorities should be:

Hunter Suitability then Conformation, Movement, Manners, Temperament and Education.

Hunter Suitability:

The Show Hunter should exhibit more bone and substance than the modern show Pony, Galloway and Hack but without coarseness.

It should still maintain quality without fineness. Generally the Show Hunter should be a substantial build without being overweight and

capable of carrying its rider with ease and safety, having controlled energy and strong easy paces.

Conformation:

Show Hunters should possess quality, correct saddle horse conformation and exhibit natural balance. Any deviation in conformation

that may cause unsoundness should be penalised.

Movement:

Show Hunters should go forward with straightness of action and freedom of movement, covering the ground in all paces with rhythm, balance and impulsion. They should possess a well balanced gallop moving from the shoulder with hind quarters engaged. In trot, a stilted action is unacceptable. A Show Hunter’s movement should be ground covering whilst being straight, careful and slightly plainer than the more extravagant movement of a Show Hack, whilst appearing smooth, effortless, elevated and clean. Extreme, flashy movement is not acceptable in the Show Hunter, nor is short, choppy movement with high knee action.

Manners and Temperament:

Manners are extremely important and small misdemeanours, which may be overlooked in the show Pony, Galloway or Hack, should be penalised in a Show Hunter. The Show Hunter should display boldness but at the same time possess a steady disposition, be obedient and forward going without pulling or going too fast.

The Workout:

The workout should be similar to that of the open saddle class and should include a gallop but only at the judge’s discretion. Horses should be worked both ways on the ring at walk, trot and canter. An individual workout should then be set. In the individual workout the horses should be worked on both reins and are expected to be able to perform the walk, trot, canter, lengthened canter, hand gallop and the halt. Lengthened trot is not a requirement of this class, however a strong working trot is desirable.

Presentation:

A straight cut show or dressage saddle or a general purpose saddle which should be clean, neat and well fitting but more “workmanlike” than for ridden show classes.

Snaffle or Double bridle with a plain brow band and noseband.

No ribbon, coloured or fancy brow bands.

EA approved bits; choice is optional but should of course fit properly.

Personal Appointments:

The dress code for the Show Hunter classes is generally far more conservative and understated than the open ridden show classes.

Jackets: English riding coat preferably Tweed - jackets of blue, green or brown mixture. The colour should be chosen to complement the horse or pony.

Hats: Approved Safety Helmet. The helmet should be covered by plain velvet in a dark colour, which tones with the jacket.

Shirt & Tie: A shirt with a proper collar in a tone which matches the jacket and a plain or discreetly patterned tie or stock.

Jodhpur or Breeches: Fawn or beige. If jodhpurs are worn they should be held down with jodhpur clips.

Boots: Black or Brown. Adults may wear long boots or gaiters..

Spurs: Dummy spurs are permitted.

Buttonholes: Wedding style flowers or coloured lapel rosettes are not acceptable.

Gloves: Should be plain (not white string or brightly coloured) and should match the boots.

Whips or Canes: A Whip or cane (with or without a flapper) maximum length must not exceed 75cm (30 inches). Working Hunter canes with a lash are not permitted unless the lash is removed.

Dressage whips are NOT permitted.

Ridden Challenge

Judged by all 3 judges.

Each judge will award a score out of 10 for presentation and a score out of 10 for the workout.

The workout will be a set workout –see below.

Places will be awarded as Top 5 including a Champion & Reserve.

All classes with the exception of the beginners ring can be point scored.

*Entries will not be catalogued.

*Stewards in each ring will be checking that ONLY horses entered in a class are in that class.

Please keep a record of classes entered.

*Canteen facilities will be available.

*All results will be published on our web site. All palomino results will be sent to the RAS for consideration.

*All members are requested to take home all rubbish as the society will be charged for rubbish left on grounds OR in bins.

*Yards are available on the grounds at no charge. The society takes no responsibility for the condition of yards. Yards are to be cleaned and the chains done up when vacated and straw etc. deposited in the designated areas. A cleaning fee will be levied if yards are left unclean.

*Camping is available at no charge.

*The shower/toilet block will be open.

*No rope or electric fence yards may be erected.

*No hoses to be kept in the beginners yards or loose in the main arena.

*No dogs permitted

*No horses should be taken into areas marked "No horses beyond this point" or "No horses."

*Biosecurity- Any horse which is sick should not be brought to the event. Contact between horses should be kept to a minimum. Exhibitors should provide individual feed and water containers. No equipment should be shared. Horses should be kept in their allocated stable/yard or at their own float.

*Hot weather- A decision will be made on the day to dispense with riding jackets due to heat.

Exhibitors are reminded to keep their horses in shaded areas where possible and to provide drinking water throughout the day as is appropriate.

*In the unfortunate circumstance that a horse or rider should be unfit to compete on the day of the show the Committee will consider a refund upon the member supplying a Vet certificate or a Doctors certificate. No refund will be considered without one of these documents.

*No open fires, braziers or anything that generates a naked flame is allowed on the showground.
